take a historic step forward.


Nurses, from coast to coast, unanimously adopted a resolution acknowledging nursing's role in past harms and committing to truth, reconciliation, and

In her address, UNA President, Heather Smith said, "We apologize to Indigenous Peoples for not listening to you, for devaluing the wisdom that has sustained your communities for generations and for dismissing the knowledge which has kept

She added that, "True health care must be co-created, rooted in respect, reciprocity and the recognition that Indigenous knowledge is not only valid, but vital." The apology marked a meaningful beginning for reconciliation, equity, and justice in health care.
