Did You Know?

The very first nursing school in Canada opened its doors 150 years ago - in 1874, at the General and Marine Hospital in St. Catharines, Ontario.

Founded by Dr. Theophilus Mack, the St. Catharines Training School for Nurses, marked the beginning of formal nurse training in the country. The program was influenced by the Nightingale system.

Students weren't just learning - they were the nursing staff. They worked long hours, covered private cases, and often had their wages redirected back to the

hospital.

And here's a full-circle moment: this June, the Canadian Federation of Nurses Union Biennial Convention will be held in the Niagara Region, where St. Catharines is located. What better place to gather Canada's nurses than the birthplace of formal nursing education in the country?
