Building Capacity, Builds Alberta

When little Emma spiked a fever in the middle of the night, her parents had a choice no family should face: wait and hope, or drive an hour and a half in the dark to the nearest staffed Emergency Room.

For too many Albertans, especially in rural communities, this isn't a rare crisis. It's daily life.

ERs are closing temporarily, wait times are growing, and nurses are burning out. People are driving hours just to see a doctor.

But there is a solution. **Capacity.**

Building capacity means hiring and keeping more health care workers so rural hospitals stay open all the time. It means investing in equipment and infrastructure so care is close to home. And it means keeping health care public, safe, and accessible, so no one has to wonder whether they can afford to get sick.

When we invest in care, we invest in Alberta. A strong health system keeps rural communities thriving, attracts new families and businesses, and makes sure every Albertan, from High Level to Medicine Hat, can live with the peace of mind that help is there when they need it.

Our [Alberta Needs Care](#) campaign isn't about politics. It's about making sure that when Emma gets sick, her parents can comfort her, not calculate the miles to the nearest ER.

Forever Canadian Petition

Alberta's future is on the table and so are the programs and protections we rely on every day.

The Forever Canadian campaign has launched a very straight-forward and yet important petition question: Do you agree that Alberta should remain in Canada?

If the Forever Canadian petition collects enough valid signatures by [October 28](#) then a province-wide referendum could be held asking Albertans if they want to remain in Canada.

This effort matters because separation could have serious consequences, for public health care, pensions like the CPP, and even your ability to move freely across provinces for work or retirement.

Signing this petition will make sure Albertans get to weigh in before any decision about leaving Canada is made. Petitions must be signed in person.

Canada's Nurses Are Speaking Out on Gaza

In the letter, CFNU highlights attacks on hospitals and health workers, the collapse of medical infrastructure, and the ongoing humanitarian crisis and urged Canada to push for a ceasefire, support a two-state solution, and take stronger political and economic measures.
