


Faced with low pay, understaffing, and increasingly difficult working conditions, they decided it was time to take a stand. With determination in their hearts, UNA

members voted overwhelmingly to strike, demanding fair wages and better

The strike wasn't just about pay - it was about respect, fairness, and ensuring a safer, more effective healthcare system. For 18 days, nurses across Alberta held firm, showing the strength of their solidarity.







Now, 25 years later, the impact of that pivotal moment still echoes through Alberta's healthcare system. The legacy of that strike continues to shape how we think about workers' rights, fairness, and the value of those who care for our health.
